











### Pedder 2013

It is Tasmania's biggest angling competition on Australia's largest freshwater lake (242 square kilometres) and it's very well managed.

Lake Pedder is set in the heart of the world's most magnificent World Heritage Wilderness and Conservation Area of over 600,000 hectares. There is but one road in to this most picturesque highland lake, nestled amongst shear peaks rising sharply to over 1000 metres above sea level and there are abundant numbers of trout which require thinning out! How privileged we are to be able to spend 5 days fishing in a lake such as Pedder every January long weekend. The Lake Pedder Angling Club are to be commended on their organisation of such a smooth running event. Luckily the committee is a family affair or else they wouldn't see each other when organising hots up. President, Matthew Mallinson works year round for the club, whilst his wife Sharon juggles the secretarial role with family and work commitments. Luckily, Sharon's dad (and mum) helps out whilst also holding down the role of Vice-President of the club. President Matt and Secretary Sharon, being strongly family focused themselves (probably due to their own upbringing in a caring fishing and outdoors family) made sure there were a variety of events and activities that catered for everyone. They are of course supported by a very hard working committee and members during the twelve months it takes to organise such a big event. The entire committee is to be commended for their outstanding organisation.

Success can be measured by the great family atmosphere with a wide range of planned and spontaneous activities for all ages. This year's carnival atmosphere was aided by great summer weather, although the extreme heat made fishing during the day hard except for those who have really mastered Lake Pedder. Chalet and club house was often full and a constant hive of activity

Due to the day time heat and predominantly blue sky, early starts were needed this year more than ever. Some who thought 5.30 am was early, found the once crowded streets empty of cars. The launching ramp car park and overflow trailer park, on the other hand, were packed with cars and empty trailers long before the sun came up. For the novice, Pedder does fish in its own unique way. Lot's of fish are on offer, but know-how is needed.

Sponsors too deserve great credit for their significant contributions to this major event. The major prize of beautifully built aluminium boat, mercury motor and King trailer package was a major drawcard, thanks to consistent supporters Peter Fisher at TriStar Marine, Adrian at Channel Marine (Mercury Agents) and King Towbars and Trailers Hobart. One Steel and Ullrich Metals also contributed to the boat package this year. As always we are supported by a great number of additional Major sponsors: Rapala, Wigston Lures, Lake Pedder Chalet, Hydro Tasmania, Petuna and Able Australia. These generous community minded citizens help us raise significant sums for important charities as well as keeping the club running and facilities upgraded. This year we raised \$3645.20 for charity. Half will be given to Able Australia and the other half used for the Camp Quality Day at the club pond later this year. We raised \$31 in the tin on the bar for the Tasmanian bush fire appeal.

Many walked away with lots of goodies from the various auctions and raffles. I'm sure we look forward to this as much as the fishing itself.



As for the competition itself, 169 anglers registered 654 fish during the 5 days of the competition at an average weight of 442 grams. That works out at a little less than one fish per day each, but some entrants don't fish much and some do very much better as you will see below.

### What not to do when Snagged...

I thought you might like to see the new "lure retriever" that Laurie and I have on his boat, which we perfected during the comp. As per normal, we managed to hook our share of twigs, logs, bushes and underwater monsters while chucking lures around for the elusive trout. Most times we could get the snagged lure off by steaming up to the hook-up, putting our rod tip down in the water to knock off the lure, and away we'd go. Risking a \$500 rod tip for a \$30 lure doesn't always make sense, but 99% of the time it's fine and it works for us when we're fishing around the twigs lots.

However, on one occasion there was just no way we could get the snag free.

Laurie had hooked up, and the lure was deeper than he could reach with his rod. So, while he went down the stern to get his famous "tackle back" lure retriever, I thought I'd be able to "help out" and couldn't resist reaching into the water with my arm and his rod......oops. Yep, you guessed it. The rod tip got hooked onto the lure as well. Damn. So, now, imagine we're hanging off a snag, with me unable to let go of Laurie's rod (his favourite of course) as it's hooked to the lure on the snag, him down the stern scrabbling around in a box of bits trying to find the tackle back retriever, and me holding rod in one hand under the water, while using the other hand to work his electric motor controls, trying to keep us on top of the snag while going around in circles.

No way the "tackle back" lure retriever could work, as now the rod was hooked up, so there was no line for us to send the tackle back retriever down......what to do? Aha - the new tackle back retriever came into action!

I'm hanging off the rod and snag, while Laurie drops the anchor alongside and, after a few jiggles of it, "hey presto", we've got the entire snag on the end of the anchor line. A bit of tug and grunt, and the snag comes up with lure, rod, line and all intact.

Cheap option for those considering alternative lure retrievers, and 100% success rate for us! Not sure I'd try it again though - I was seriously contemplating having to go for a swim to release Laurie's rod, and it was a good alternative compared to that, for sure!!






