Well how did you go with the questions?

Here are the answers to Marine Radio questions that were in the July Southwest Bulletin

1. Can I use or do I know the correct terminology for marine operations?

Answer: *Only use these radios if you are competent and understand the correct procedures for calling and working.*

ALSO teach your junior anglers to use the radios it may mean they save your life in an emergency.

2. What does the silence periods mean on channel 16? and when are they observed? also what does it mean?

Answer: *In Australia silence periods are monitored on channel 16 each half hour, this is to allow listening watch for weak signals to be heard. Radio operators conserve battery power by turning off radios until they know someone will be listing. This will be Coast radio stations etc so if you are chatting on 16 - you may be told to change channels remember VHF 16-67 is recorded.*

3. What is channel 16 used for?

Answer: *Distress, Urgency, Safety and Calling, this is why the club uses channel 77 as chatter channel.*

4. Can I receive and relay a mayday call?

Answer: *Only answer a mayday call if you are in a position to relay the correct details to police or a coast station. You maybe the only person to hear the call so you have the obligation to answer it. Most people listen for a short period and usually another vessel or station will reply.*

5. If your boat runs out of petrol in the middle of the lake , is this a mayday or pan-pan?

Answer: *If the vessel is not in immediate danger it is a Pan-pan but if you are drifting onto rocks the vessel is in danger so it becomes a Mayday.*

6. You find a large piece of wood floating in the lake, what action do you take?

Answer: *Security call to all stations advising them of the hazard and location attach some sort of marker to identify the hazard.*

7. Do you know the phonetic alphabet? also can you pronounce or say the words correctly?

Answer: *Test. Can you work out the following;*

LEE MAH, ALFA, KILO, ECHO, POH PAH, ECHO, DELTA, DELTA, ECHO, ROMEO, ALFA, NOVEMBER, GOLF, LEA MAH, INDIA, NOVEMBER, GOLF, CHARLIE, LEAMAH, UNIFORM, BRAVO.

In some situations you may be asked to spell the wording using this alphabet, especially if communications are poor.

8. Which call procedure is correct ?

a. **Pedder Wilderness Lodge, Pedder Wilderness Lodge, Pedder Wilderness Lodge, this is Ridiculous , this is Ridiculous, this is Ridiculous on channel 77 over**

or **if radio communications are good Pedder Wilderness Lodge this is Ridiculous, Ridiculous over**

b. **Ridiculous calling Pedder Wilderness Lodge , Ridiculous calling Pedder Wilderness Lodge are you receiving**

Answer: *reverse calling NOT USED IN MARINE COMMUNICATIONS OR AVIATION.*



Unfortunately the Trout Classic Arthurs lake round was on the same weekend as the STLAA Lake Crescent Day which meant a lot of the trout community were split 2 ways between the Trout Classic and the STLAA Lake Crescent event. For those of us at Crescent we had a ball. This was the first of a new interclub event hosted by the STLAA. A different STLAA affiliated club will be selected to arrange it each year and that club will nominate the fishery to hold this event at. This year it was hosted by the Bridgewater Anglers club and was held on Lake Crescent. The competition is to be fished from daylight until 4pm, when all are to leave the water for the weigh in. The weigh in this year was at the Bridgewater club house at Lake Sorell.

So how did we go? In our boat fishing started off easy two fish landed in 20 minutes, all thought we were in for a big day. Another couple of fish struck and were dropped and from there the day went downhill..... The wind came up and blew. It blew some more and some more.....fishing became incredibly difficult to say the least. By 2 O'clock in the afternoon after battling wind for 5 hours, we finally gave up. Heading into the boat ramp, only to find that everyone else left on the lake had also called time out. Everyone had either already packed up and left or were heading off the water around the same time as us. Three fish were caught by LPAC members, the largest being about 2kg and we came second in the interclub competition.

Many thanks to the Bridgewater club for hosting a great event. Thanks to all LPAC members that participated in this day and we look forward to doing it all again next year. Next year we will take our partners who while fishing went to present the club and our upcoming Australia Day competition at the Longford Show. They told us that the wind also caused them a lot of grief and packing up the marquees and stand was incredibly difficult with the wind. Next years event will be hosted by the Clarence Anglers club at a yet to be named fishery.
